

Adopt-A-Park Program Parks, Trails and Open Space

Neighborhood Parks:

Crestwood Park, 2010 Valley View Drive, 4.33 acre developed neighborhood park, playground equipment, half-court basketball, gazebo, picnic tables and benches, loop fitness trail with fitness equipment.

Red Mountain Adventure Park, 1015 Evergreen Heights Drive, 3.32 acre developed neighborhood park, 8,500 square-foot concrete skate park and dirt BMX course, playground equipment, picnic shelter, picnic table and benches.

Cavalier Park, 522 Woodland Avenue, 1.5 acre developed neighborhood park, playground equipment, basketball court, picnic table and pathway (section of American Discovery Trail).

Regency Park, 1.7 acre developed neighborhood park, pathway with picnic tables and benches.

Chimney Park, 4.7 acre undeveloped neighborhood park, master planned, proposed improvements include open green spaces to be used for multi-use play, picnic tables, small picnic shelter and pathway.

Sun Valley Park, 6.22 acre undeveloped neighborhood park, master planned, improvements are located at the south side of the park and will include a picnic shelter, picnic tables, playground equipment and wildlife viewing area with interpretive signage along pathway.

Park View Estates Park, 1.55 acre undeveloped neighborhood park, primarily an open, level field with a drainage swale running the eastern portion of the site.

Hilltop Park, .644 acre undeveloped pocket park, very small site with a fairly large hill that could be used for sledding.

Forest Edge Park, 4 acre undeveloped neighborhood park, narrow, circular strip of land adjacent to Woodland Park High School, surrounding residential backyards.

Country Ridge, 2.08 acre undeveloped neighborhood park, forested land with trail access to Pike National Forest.

Community Parks:

Memorial Park, 3.32 acre developed community park, Original and oldest park in town, master planned for re-development starting in 2015.

Special Use Parks:

Bergstrom Park, .47 acre developed special use park, tourist rest area including picnic shelter, picnic tables, restrooms, historical marker and amphitheater.

History Park, .32 acre special use park, home of Brockhurst Cabin, Immer Cabin and Carroll Den.

Lions Park, .8 acre special use park, open plaza area.

Paradise Estates Bus Stop Park, 1.28 acre special use park, a small shelter was built for children to utilize as a bus stop.

Junction House, .549 acre open space with a cabin and garage.

Open Space, Natural Areas and Greenways:

Peyton's Park, .4 acre open space natural area.

Loft Village Park, .4 acre open space natural area.

Forest Edge, 2.41 acre open space natural area

Country Ridge Cul-De-Sac Access Points, 60 foot wide dedicated property to provide access to Pike National Forest.

Woodland Park Plaza Greenway, 3.9 acre trail corridor adjacent to Fountain Creek (Ute Pass Trail and American Discovery Trail).

Paradise Estates, 19.85 acres open space natural area, greenway, wildlife and drainage corridor.

Walmart Open Space, 9.5 acres open space, west side of Fountain Creek .

Sport Complexes:

Meadow Wood Sports Complex, 43.83 acre partially developed sports complex, master planned, facilities include a synthetic turf baseball field, two synthetic turf soccer fields, three natural turf ball fields, four lighted tennis courts, outdoor hockey rink, playground equipment, concession stand and jogging and fitness pathway.

Trails and Trailheads:

Centennial Trail and Trailhead, 3.7 miles of paved trail.
