WHEN DOES THE CITY BEGIN PLOWING?

The City begins plowing snow once 4 inches of snow has accumulated, or as conditions may require. Plowing routes are prioritized to accommodate the City's greatest needs.

WHAT ARE THE CITY'S SNOWPLOW PRIORITY ROUTES?

- 1. PRIORITY LEVEL 1**
First Responder roadways
- 2. PRIORITY LEVEL 2**
Bus routes and sidewalks to area schools
- 3. PRIORITY LEVEL 3**
Secondary roadways
- 4. PRIORITY LEVEL 4**
Alley-ways and cul-de-sacs

WINTER-WEATHER REMINDERS:

1. Snow from private property must not be pushed into city roadways or sidewalks per Woodland Park City Code 12.02.010
2. During storms, please refrain from parking on city roads or right-of-ways. this limits plow access.
3. Please keep garbage cans off City streets during winter storms.
4. Remind children not to play on snow mounds created by plows
5. Occasionally snow berms may be created after plows pass by. Homeowners can help reduce this possibility by clearing 3ft of snow from either side of their driveway near the curb.
6. For homeowners with gravel driveways, please do not plow across a public street, as it creates additional debris.
